If it is a minor knock, staff in class will inform you at the end of the day. If it is a bigger knock that makes a bruise or cut to the head/face we will phone you as soon as possible after

the injury. This does not mean we expect you to rush to school, it is to inform you of the knock so you can make an informed decision about any actions. School would tell you if we thought you needed to come to collect your child. Advice will be given to parents/carers about monitoring their child at home after a head injury.

## **Labelling Clothing**

Please ensure your child's name is in all jumpers, shirts, trousers, PE kits, shoes etc...This will help in the return of lost items and save staff time looking for lost clothing. Thank you.

Dear Parent/Carers. Are you struggling with your child's behaviour at home? Are bedtimes and mornings a nightmare? Is your child a fussy eater or does your child struggle to leave you at school time? If you answered yes to any of these questions, then maybe I can help? My name is Sharon McCormick and I am the Home/School liaison worker for your child's school. I am available to support any parent/carers who may need advice or support. I can also support with other issues affecting family like for example, divorce and separation, housing issues and benefits. If I cannot help you personally, I can refer to more specialised services who will be expert in their field. Please ask your child's Class Teacher or the Headteacher if you would like some contact from me. I also operate a monthly drop in service where you can
