## **Questions raised (response in read)**

- I feel there could be more clubs for girls or less sports more crafts.
   We don't discourage any child (boy or girl) from attending a club. We are looking in to the possibility of providing some other clubs that are not sports orientated so it has a wider appeal to the children.
- Would be nice if reading with your child could be done on a variety of days rather than only
  one, as not all parents are able to do the designated day.
- Reading in class-could this be rotated each week.
   We are looking to change the reading day each half term so that parents/carers can, hopefully, find a day that would suit them. If we tried to rotate it on a weekly basis people would forget which day it was on and this would impact on the numbers attending.
- The only thing I really don't like is that its rules make me feel guilty when I want and need to look after my sick or ill child. I fell that attendance should never be more important than any child's wellbeing.
  If a child is sick, we fully understand a child having to stay at home until they are better. We encourage parents to send children in to school when they say they don't feel well as they often 'perk up' when they are in school, busy with their friends. The government places a statutory duty on schools to monitor attendance and meet with parents/carers of children whose attendance is low. The aim of the meeting is to see how we can support families to improve attendance.
- I don't agree with the reading 5 times a week to get a star as this is especially hard to achieve
  in our house. I then feel our children feel disappointed when their friends are achieving this
  goal and they are unable to 3 times a week seems more achievable and more if they can or
  will.
  - Reading is an essential life skills and we do everything we can in school to support children to develop and improve this skill. It is vitally important that children are also supported/encouraged to read at home. All children and families are different and whilst some will find 5 reads at home easy, others will find this more of a challenge. However, the fact that reading covers lots of activities should make this more achievable. Children may read their school book, read any other book, practise key words and/or phonics, look for and read words in the environment, reading shopping lists and food labels in supermarkets. All of these activities can be recorded in their diary and count towards their 5 reads a week.
- I do sometimes feel communication between teachers and parents could be improved. A letter outlining upcoming topics, could perhaps be sent home and certain reward systems etc... explained the golden table, gold box.
  Teachers are always available at the start of the day to catch up with you or are happy to make an appointment to talk with you in more detail. We held curriculum meetings at the start of the year to outline topics, the information was also sent home and shared in the newsletter. We also put a brief note in there about the golden table. We will look at providing other ways of sharing this information with parents and carers. So you all feel fully informed and involved in your child's learning.
- I feel the teachers should read with my reception child and write in their learning diary so I can compare reading with home.
   All parents/carers will have the opportunity to meet with class teachers to discuss their

child's progress and plan next steps in learning and development. There is unlikely to be sufficient detail recorded in diaries to make home/school comparisons. This would be far better achieved through discussion with class teachers.
