Covid 19 Update

In school we are cleaning tables, chairs and equipment regularly. Children are not sharing things in their usual way. Children are staying in their class bubble and are not moving around school. It is working well so far! It is vitally important however, that if your child displays any symptoms of Covid 19 that you keep them at home. Your child and anyone in your household must then isolate for 14 days. You can have a Covid test, which I would strongly recommend, to see if any of you have a confirmed case. If

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the test is negative they may return to school. If the test is positive they must isolate for 7 days. Please let the school know immediately if you have a positive test, as we will need to isolate the rest of the children in that bubble. Please see the email attachment for more information.

If your child is currently in school but is unable to attend as they are ill, this doesn't necessarily have to link to Covid, please call the office as you would usually do.

Covid 19 Symptoms are:

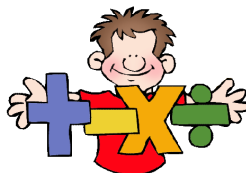
high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature.)

new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual.)

loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.
