This doesn't make it bad! Your job is to help them understand these emotions and reassure them that it will be different but that is also exciting. This is part of being resilient. All of the staff in school will still be here in September. Current teachers will visit classes in September to say hello. Everyone will be at very different stages academically and emotionally and we are here to support all children in the best way possible.

This will result in you being charged for additional sessions or sessions being withdrawn. HMRC will often give advice that is different to that of Essex County.
