Communication and Language

- Listening to longer stories and
- remembering more of what happens
- -Using a wider range of vocabulary
- -Learning to express points of view and debating when we disagree
- with an adult or a friend
- -Continuing to practise sounds and tenses
- -Learning the meaning of new words
- -Keeping conversations going
- -Listening to and following two-part instructions

Expressive Art & Design

- Developing more complex stories using small-world toys and equipment
- Making imaginative 'smallworlds' with blocks and construction equipment
- Developing our own ideas and then deciding which materials to use to express them
- Continuing to add detail to our drawings and using drawing to represent ideas
- Listening to different sounds
- Responding to different types of music
- 'pitch matching' by singing the pitch of a tone sung by another person
- Playing instruments with increasing control

Physical Development

- Practising skipping, hopping, standing on one leg, and moving in different ways
- Throwing, catching and kicking balls to practise aim and control
- Initiating and joining in with group games and making up games with friends
- Developing our gross-motor skills & making large body movements
- Holding and using scissors effectively
- Learning to be 'sun safe'

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Developing our sense of responsibility and being part of a community
- Practising skills of assertion, negotiation and compromise
- Showing more confidence in social situations
- Recognising and talking about our own and others' feelings

State and

Mathematics

- Talking about and exploring 2D and 3D shapes
- Describing routes that are familiar to us
- Continuing to practise fast recognition of objects 'subitising' to 3, then 5
- Experimenting with our own symbols and/or marks
- Extending and creating ABAB patterns and spotting errors in patterns

Understanding the World

- Planting seeds and caring for growing plants
- Learning and understanding the key features of the life cycle of a plant and an animal
- Developing our understanding of the wider world by talking about different countries and the differences we have experienced or seen in photographs or on screen

Literacy

- Learning the names of different features of a book
- Continuing to practise drawing recognisable figures and correctly forming some letters in our names
- Engaging in conversations about stories
- Spotting and suggesting rhymes
- Clapping syllables in words
- Developing our understanding that print has meaning and can be used for different purposes
- Ascribing meaning to drawings, paintings and early writing
- Handling different types of books with care
