### **Bumped Heads**



Following a review of our procedures for informing parents/carers of a bumped head, from January we are going to make one important change.

If a child bumps their head in school, they will be assessed by a first-aider and these steps will be followed:

- The child will be assessed by a school first-aider and appropriate treatment given e.g. a cold compress.
- A 'bumped head note' will be put in the child's bag or handed to the parent/carer on collection.
- If the head bump is assessed as needing urgent medical attention, a phone call will be made and you will be asked to collect your child.
- With EVERY head bump a text will be sent to you to inform you
  of the time of the bump. This does NOT mean you need to
  collect your child but simply indicates the time of the bump for
  monitoring purposes. They may have no visible injury but this is
  just a precaution.

Mrs Humm did a very professional job of leading all the runners around each lap and lots of fun was had by all. We will let you know a total sponsorship total as soon as we know.


#### **Christmas Grotto**
